Principal's Report

St Marys Senior High School's calendar has been packed full of activities over the last fortnight and the final three weeks of Term 1 continue to be busy. Every weekend Leah posts on our social media platforms, the events of the week to assist students and families to plan their busy week. Please ensure you are following us on Facebook and Instagram to ensure you are up to date.

Since our last newsletter there have been a variety of extra-curricular events taking place at St Marys Senior High School reflecting the opportunities available to students including PULSE Alive, lunchtime concerts, Premier's Debating Competition, titration training, Lions Youth of the Year Public Speaking competition, university visits, white card training, academic counselling, excursions and school photos. Over the next three weeks, there will be seven Period 0 days to assist with the smooth running of assessment tasks for both Year 11 and Year 12. More extra-curricular events will take place and we will be hosting our Open Evening for prospective students and their families whilst providing an opportunity for current students

to develop their leadership skills as faculty and school ambassadors.

As Year 12 progress through their final year of schooling, many students are looking at applying for scholarships and early entry into university. Many of these pathways require students to obtain recommendations from their school. At St Marys Senior High School, these recommendations are completed by the Principal. Staff are not able to complete written recommendations. This week Year 12 students will receive an email, explaining this process including the information that is required to be uploaded to support a written recommendation. It is imperative that students book in a time with me if they have any questions about this process. If students leave a request for a recommendation to the last minute, their recommendation may be limited and not reflect the full extent of their skills and capabilities. The Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) through UAC can be submitted once it is opened. The recommendations for the SRS will be completed following the Trial Higher School Certificate Examinations.

Attendance

It has been great to have our students in clasrooms and settling into the school year. I know all of our teachers are looking forward to a successful 2024 and are excited to work with students, parents, carers and families to make this a memorable year.

The evidence is clear that consistent attendance is the essential first step for students to have a positive experience at school, particularly during Year 11 and Year 12.

Every day matters for a student's learning. Missing school for students means missing course work, assignments, time with friends and a range of other school activities. Students are required to attend school every day that they are well enough to do so. The more time students attend school, the greater their opportunity to learn, make new friends and improve their wellbeing.

If a student is absent from school, parents and carers need to let us know as soon as possible and within seven days of the absence. The absence may be for part of a school day or for all of the school day. Parents and carers are able to notify the school in a number of ways, including:

- Using the Sentral Parent Portal,
- Emailing the school <u>stmaryssen-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>,
- Calling the school and talking to one of our Administration Team, or
- Writing a note, which students can bring to the Administration Team.

While there will be times when students are unable to be at school (for example, when they are unwell), everything should be done to ensure that they spend as much time at school as possible. For example,



medical appointments should take place outside school hours where possible and family holidays should be taken in term breaks.

Our staff are here to work with students, parents, carers and families to help ensure that attendance at school is optimised, and there are also helpful resources for parents and carers on the Department of Education's Every Day Matters website, found at https://education.nsw.gov.au/schooling/schooling-initiatives/every-day-matters

As this is our last newsletter for the term, I would like to wish our students, families, staff and community supporters a restful holiday. I hope you are able to spend some time with those that are important to you and recharge, ready for Term 2.

ASPIRE

What is ASPIRE?

Anxiety is an emotion characterised by feelings of tension, worried thoughts and physical changes like increased blood pressure. People with anxiety disorders usually have recurring intrusive thoughts or concerns. They may avoid certain situations out of worry.



Anxiety is a normal response to stress and isn't always a bad thing. But when it gets to be uncontrollable or excessive to the point where it affects quality of life, this may be indicative of an anxiety disorder.

Approximately 70% of anxiety behaviours are learned. This is where our ASPIRE Program comes in.

Over the course of the term our students have been introduced to the ASPIRE Program, with Year 11 students learning material through Cluster presentations and the Mentor Program while Year 12 students have been learning through both Cluster meetings and Personal Mentor sessions.

In recent years we have noticed a greater incidence in the rise of anxiety-related concerns for our students which has had an impact on their ability to manage not only their studies effectively but also their day to day lives. Research tells us that the good news is that we are able to retrain our brains to ensure that we use more effective coping strategies when faced with stressors in our lives.

All of our school staff have been trained in ASPIRE over the course of last term, providing colleagues with strategies to recognise and address anxiety related behaviours. The training we continue to undertake with our students provides them with the skills they need to recognise signs of stress and implement positive coping strategies at these times. Over the course of this year through our school newsletter, we will provide parents, carers and families with information about ASPIRE and suggest some helpful strategies to help our young people.
















