due to heavy rain on the day we were forced to change our arrangements, especially in light of the limited wet weather cover offered at Ripples St Marys. We offered students the opportunity to compete but also ensured that students who chose to stay at school could continue with learning in the drier conditions offered in learning spaces. Thank you to the outstanding organisation of the PDHPE team and congratulations to all involved in our activities on the day. Best wishes to our students who will represent St Marys Senior High School at the Werrington Zone swimming carnival.

We have met with the local highway patrol following concerns raised about the number of cars dropping students off on Kalang Avenue and double parking. We will continue to work with the police to ensure the safety of all students, pedestrians and other road users. We ask that parents drop students off on Creek Road or on the appropriate sections of Kungala Street.

I have included in this newsletter the complete code of conduct from Transport NSW regarding student travel on public transport for your reference. Although most of our students are respectful to other transport users there have been occasions when commuters have raised concerns. Sometimes this is an issue with a single user or relates to the number of students who utilise the public transport system. Sometimes genuine concerns are raised which we need to address. I encourage students and parents to go through the code of conduct to avoid the risk of losing their School Opal Card.

Excursions

At St Marys Senior High School there are a variety of extra-curricula activities offered including excursions to support students in their academic pursuits. It is vital that students adhere to due dates for these excursions to ensure that our organisation runs smoothly. The Department of Education requires each excursion to include an extensive risk assessment differentiated for the students attending the excursion. This takes an enormous amount of time for the organising staff and we require your support to ensure that we meet our work, health and safety requirements.

To ensure that all students are provided with an opportunity to engage in these experiences, the school may be able to provide some financial support to families who are struggling with school costs. Please contact your child's Deputy Principal to discuss the options available.

How do I get involved with the school?

St Marys Senior High School does not have a P&C group. A School Council made up of parents, students, community members and staff make up the Council and meet on the fourth Tuesday of every month. Every representative group has a specific number of voting rights and are elected at the annual general meeting, the first meeting of the year. The AGM will take place on Tuesday 25 February 2020 in the meeting room in the Administration Block at 6pm. If parents want to be involved in decision making related to our school and develop a better understanding of the school's operations this may be the path you choose to take. The

parent representative group requires three voting members at each meeting. I encourage you to consider attending the first meeting to gain an insight into the School Council.

If you would like to attend the School Council meeting, please contact the school via the school email address stmaryssen-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au for catering purposes. At this meeting we will go over the Constitution, explaining each representative group on Council.

Year 12 will soon commence their first session with their Personal Mentors. This is an additional layer of support provided to assist students in their final year of formal schooling. The connections made in Personal Mentor have been highly valued by past students as stated in their exit surveys. I hope you take full advantage of this opportunity.

Code of conduct for school students on metro and train services, and at stations

All students are to behave in a manner that ensures both their comfort and safety and that of other passengers in order to retain their school travel pass.



Students will:

- Obey all signage instructions on metro and train services and at stations.
- Behave safely at all times (e.g. avoid running or riding bikes, scooters or skates on metro and train services and at stations, keep off metro and train lines, keep arms, legs and other body parts inside the metro or train, refrain from touching metro or train doors, safety equipment or any part of a moving metro or train).
- Use non-offensive language and behave appropriately at all times on rail property (e.g. avoid swearing, spitting, fighting, throwing items, keep feet off seats).
- Protect rail property and report graffiti and vandalism.
- Keep yourself and anything you are carrying clear of aisles, steps, thoroughfares and behind the yellow line on platforms.
- Take your rubbish with you and dispose of it thoughtfully.
- Follow the instructions of station staff, drivers, guards, transport officers and Police officers.
- Carry your School Pass during all school-related travel.
- Spread out along the platform so as not to overcrowd one carriage. Avoid boarding carriages that are already overcrowded.
- Allow other passengers to get off metro and train services before boarding and then board without delay.
- Move inside the carriage and stand away from the doors during travel.
- Comply with all laws relating to conduct and behaviour while travelling on public transport.

- Not possess any prohibited items, such as knives, spray cans or other implements intended for use in damaging property.
- Adhere to the law that bans smoking and drinking alcohol at stations, and on metro and train services.
- Use the School Travel Pass only for its intended purpose.
- Keep their School Pass for their own use – not lend their School Pass to other students or borrow one from them.

If issued with a School Opal Card, students must always tap on at the beginning of their metro and train trips and tap off at the end, even at stations without ticket gates.

The School Pass may be confiscated and a fine may also apply if these rules are not followed.

Vandalism is a serious criminal offence. Students caught tagging, etching or vandalising metro and train services and stations will be arrested and may face criminal charges.

Consequences of inappropriate behaviour

Unacceptable behaviour such as using offensive or racist language, disobeying reasonable directions from the driver, smoking, spitting, damaging property, eating on the bus, distracting the driver with persistent noise and failing to show the travel pass may lead to:

- Loss of subsidised school travel privileges for up to two school weeks for a second offence, and up to 10 school weeks for subsequent offences.
- Permanent suspension of school travel privileges or banning from travelling on buses may apply for repeated offences.

Dangerous behaviour such as seriously bullying or harassing other passengers, fighting, letting any part of your body protrude from the bus, throwing objects inside or outside the bus, using matches and lighters, carrying dangerous items and group misbehaviour may lead to:

- Loss of subsidised school travel privileges for up to four school weeks for a first offence, and up to 10 school weeks for subsequent offences – or if group misbehaviour is involved, permanent loss of school travel privileges.
- Permanent suspension of school travel privileges or banning from travelling on buses may apply for repeated offences.

Highly dangerous behaviour such as interfering with safety equipment, pushing students out of the doors or windows, assaulting the driver or other passengers and destruction of bus property may lead to:

- Permanent loss of subsidised school travel privileges and possible court action or police prosecution.
- Banned from travelling on buses.

The police will be called to deal with highly dangerous behaviour.

These penalties reflect the seriousness of the misbehaviour. They ensure that all students who misbehave on buses are dealt with in a fair and consistent manner, no matter which bus operator or school is involved.

If students are refused travel, parents/guardians/carers must make alternative travel arrangements and meet any costs of that transport. They will not be eligible for the Transport for NSW Private Vehicle Conveyance Scheme under these circumstances.

A group of school students behaving unacceptably may risk higher penalties if their conduct puts the safety of other passengers or the driver at risk.

The operator will inform Transport for NSW of its decision. Transport for NSW may inform an operator of a student's record of misbehaviour. Please refer to the Guidelines for Managing School Students' Behaviour on Buses for dealing with incidents of inappropriate behaviour.

If a student misbehaves on a bus, the bus operator concerned will contact the parents and the school.

- Depending on the gravity of the offence, students may be required to give up their school bus travel pass or may be refused travel on the bus for a period of time determined by the bus operator.
- Heavier penalties may apply to students involved in group misbehaviour.
- School principals have the right to take additional disciplinary action against a student under the school's discipline code or student welfare policy for any breach of the code of conduct.

The bus operator must provide written notification to the parents, guardians or carers before a school bus travel pass can be withdrawn.

What to do if you disagree

If parents, guardians or carers don't agree with a decision, they should contact the bus operator. If they are still not satisfied, they can contact the nearest Transport for NSW office.





As Sally already mentioned, we have been sent reminders from Penrith Council regarding the parking restrictions in our area (please refer to our Skoolbag posts as well as the flyer found on the following page), Many of these apply on Kalang Avenue and Kungala Street. We are working with the Highway Patrol section of the NSW Police Service to optimise the safety of all drivers and pedestrians in our precinct. To this end, the Student Car Park area is designated for young drivers so that they are best able to park safely to attend classes.

ILLEGAL PARKING PUTS CHILDREN'S LIVES AT RISK

FACT Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need YOU to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.

<p>No Parking No waiting. You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. PENALTIES FROM \$187 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS</p> <p>No Stopping You must not stop on a length of road with a No Stopping sign. The first 10m from an intersection is a no stopping zone. Yellow kerb lines are also No Stopping zones. PENALTIES FROM \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS</p> <p>Bus Zone Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone. PENALTIES FROM \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS</p> <p>Mobile Phones Extra fines apply for using mobile phones in a school zone. PENALTIES FROM \$439 + 4 DEMERIT POINTS <i>May be subject to Double Demerits</i></p> <p>Speeding Offences 40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. PENALTIES FROM \$192 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS <i>May be subject to Double Demerits</i></p>	<p>Pedestrian Crossings 1. In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing. 2. Do not let your child in or out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a No Stopping zone. PENALTIES FROM \$448 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS</p> <p>Driveways & Footpaths Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath. PENALTIES FROM \$330 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS</p> <p>U turns Illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across double white lines. PENALTIES FROM \$330 + 3 DEMERIT POINTS</p> <p>Double Parking Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone. PENALTIES FROM \$330 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS</p>

ACCOMMODATION – WHERE DO I STAY?

Fujieda will organise homestay accommodation for you with your host brother or sister.

LANGUAGE – HOW WILL I COMMUNICATE?

You don't need to be able to speak Japanese. Your host brother or sister will have some understanding of the English language. Many students return from Japan with stories of the fun they had communicating or trying to communicate!
