Sydney Trains

St Marys track maintenance

From Wednesday 23 August to Friday 25 August 2023 From Thursday 31 August to Monday 4 September 2023

What we're doing

Sydney Trains will be undertaking maintenance work at St Marys from Wednesday 23 August to Friday 25 August 2023 and Thursday 31 August to Monday 4 September 2023. This work includes track welding and track rail adjustments to improve service reliability.

We understand this work may have an impact on you and appreciate your patience and understanding.

How this affects you

Noise

- These works will create additional noise at night and over the weekend.
- Work will take place:
 - From 10pm to 4am Wednesday 23 August to Friday 25 August
 - From 4am Thursday 31 August to 4pm Monday 3 September
- Equipment may be delivered to the worksite outside the above times. Some deliveries may
 occur at night due to daytime travel restrictions on large vehicles.
- Finishing works may take place following this period, including the removal of equipment.

Traffic and Parking

- Glossop Street will be closed in the southbound direction between Kurrajong Road and Phillip Street from 8pm to 4am on Wednesday 23 August and Thursday 24 August. A contraflow traffic control arrangement will be in place to allow for unloading and transport of steelwork into the rail corridor.
- A temporary road closure on Carinya Avenue will be in place from 8pm Thursday 31 August to 4am Friday 1 September to allow for material to be safely unloaded and stored.
- Parking spaces will be removed at Carinya Avenue from 4am Thursday 31 August to 4pm Monday 4 September to allow for material to be stored. Traffic Control will be in place to assist motorists to park in available spots and to assist pedestrians with the flow of construction vehicles in and outside of the rail corridor along Carinya Avenue and Camira Street.
- Heavy vehicles will be using local streets to access the rail corridor.
- While we will park our vehicles inside the rail corridor wherever possible, please be aware that on-street parking may be limited near worksites.

You will then be redirected to the payment page where you will need to tick the checkbox to authorise ongoing payments.









Year 11 2023 into Year 12 2024 Enrolment Process

Some of our Year 11 students have already been asking questions about their pattern of study for Year 12 2023, which starts in Term 4 this year. Ideally, we would like students to be focused on completing their examinations – and then, when they have received their results from these tasks, they can then make more informed choices with their parents and families about their options for Year 12. However, we have also provided the information below in case students, their parents and their families want to start thinking about this process now. We will continue to share more information after the examination period.

YEAR 11 INTO YEAR 12 ENROLMENT PROCESS

During Week 6 in Mentor, students will be shown a range of videos outlining how the subject change process works moving from Year 11 into Year 12. Some key points are below:

- Most students will keep the same subjects into Year 12 from Year 11.
- Students who wish to do an extension course must speak with both their classroom teacher and the faculty head teacher to discuss their suitability for the course.
- Students must be aware of the eligibility requirements for both the HSC and ATAR. These include:
 - Completing at least six units of Board Developed Courses.
 - o Two units of a Board Developed Course in English.
 - o Three courses of two or more units.
 - o At least four subjects.
 - The ATAR is calculated off the student's two best units of English and eight best remaining units.
 - Only one 2-Unit Category B course will count towards a student's ATAR.
- Students may choose to stop participating in a Science course and pick up Investigating Science as a replacement.
- Students may choose to drop two courses and pick up either 4 Unit Retail Services or 4 Unit Entertainment.
 - Students who choose a 4 Unit course and who would like an ATAR need to complete 12 units in their pattern of HSC study.



- Extension History, Mathematics Extension 2 and English Extension 2 will commence in Term 4 2023. No one enrolled in these courses will be permitted to drop to 10 units until 2024 and only with the recommendation of the faculty head teacher.
- The subject change will be completed via a Google Form that will be emailed out as well as provided on the year group Google Classroom. The deadline for this process is 5pm on Friday 1 September 2023. No requests will be considered after this time. Students who miss this deadline will need to wait until later in Term 4 to change levels or drop a subject.
- It is important that students discuss any change to their pattern of study with their parents and carers, their classroom teachers and their Mentors.
- Parents and carers will be sent a copy of the Google Form once it has been completed by students so that they are aware of the change request.
- All students will be supplied with a new timetable by the end of Term 3 in preparation for Term 4. This timetable is likely to be different to their current timetable and may include changes to classes and lines. This is the case, even if no request to change has been made.

There is no rush to drop a course. It is recommended that students do not drop a subject unless they are sure it is the best decision for them and their pathway. Students are reminded to seek assistance from the support services available at the school.

Are you in the right English course for Year 12? - Julie Robinson, Head Teacher English

- It is important to talk to your class teacher regarding which course would be most appropriate for you to study into Year 12. This is relevant for all students including those considering Extension 2 English.
- Listening to the advice of your class teacher, rather than considering other factors should help to ensure that you are in the right course for you and this will allow you to achieve the best possible results in your English course as well as in your overall HSC.

Are you in the right Maths course for Year 12? - Simone Pett, Head Teacher Mathematics

- It is important to talk to your class teacher regarding which course would be most appropriate for you to study into Year 12. This is relevant for all students including those considering Extension 2 Mathematics.
- Listening to the advice of your class teacher, rather than considering other factors should help to ensure that you are in the right course for you and this will allow you to achieve the best possible results in your Mathematics course as well as in your overall HSC.



4 Unit Retail Services and 4 Unit Entertainment

- If there is enough interest we will offer these courses as a 4 Unit, 1 year option 12 periods of classes each fortnight!!
- 2 units of this course can count towards your ATAR if you do the HSC exam.
- This course is a Vocational Education and Training (VET) course any if you satisfactorily meet the course requirements, you can complete a HSC subject (Category B) as well as an AQF qualification.

TAFE Options

- Anyone who is wanting to enrol in a TAFE course for their HSC (even if it is a course that is continuing from Year 11) must see Cheryll in the library to complete an enrolment form.
- There are a number of TAFE Delivered Courses Non ATAR which are one unit over one year, so they can be picked up in Year 12. Please see Cheryll for further details.

Scholarship Opportunities

Every year the school offers a number of scholarships that Year 12 students may apply for - the Bernie Shepherd Award; the Bill Eason Award; the James Rowe Award, and the Dean Lane Award.



The Bernie Shepherd Award is presented annually to a HSC student who, in the opinion of the school community, has consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies in the science and technology areas while at the same time demonstrating a significant contribution to the development of the local community or the school community of St Marys Senior High School.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in a minimum of three subjects in the science and technology fields.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the school community of St Marys Senior High School or their local community. This may be derived from a variety of fields, including:
 - a) Student leadership
 - b) School service
 - c) Community service

The Bill Eason Award is presented annually to a HSC student who, in the opinion of the school community, has consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies in the humanities area while at the same time demonstrating a significant contribution to the development of the school community of St Marys Senior High School.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in a minimum of three subjects in the humanities field.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the school community of St Marys Senior High School or their local community. This may be derived from a variety of fields, including:
 - a) Student leadership
 - b) School service
 - c) Community service



The James Rowe Award was instituted in 2012 and is presented annually to an HSC student who is pursuing a career as a teacher in education. The successful applicant needs to demonstrate a passion and commitment to teaching as well as being interested or involved in social change and have consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in a minimum of three subjects.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the pursuit of a career in teaching. This is demonstrated by enrolment in a teaching degree at university. Areas to address in your application:
 - a) Passion and commitment to teaching
 - b) Interest and action in social change

The Dean Lane Award was instituted in 2021 and will be presented annually to a HSC student who, in the opinion of the school community, has consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies in Engineering Studies and/or Design and Technology.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in Engineering Studies and/or Design and Technology.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the school community of St Marys Senior High School or their local community. This may be derived from a variety of fields, including:
 - a) Student leadership
 - b) School service
 - c) Involvement in school sporting teams
 - d) Community service

To apply for the Bernie Shepherd, Bill Eason, James Rowe and/or Dean Lane Awards

Please submit a written application to Leah Havord by 3:20 pm on Wednesday 20 September 2023.

The application should be no more than FOUR A4 typed pages in length (12 point font size and 1.5 line spacing) and address ALL of the criteria listed for the relevant award.

In addition to your application, school records will be accessed by the School Council as part of the process to select the successful scholarship applicant.



2023 Jim Anderson Scholarships

The 2023 Jim Anderson Scholarship application is now going to be in the same format as it was last year, and includes the need for the following details:

- Passport sized photo
- Name of the course TAFE or Western Sydney University course
- Personal statement why they are suitable for the Scholarship
- Career Path Plan how the Scholarship will assist them to achieve their careers goals
- School and community activities for the past two years
- 2023 School reports (Year 12 and Trial HSC results)
- Reference from Student Adviser, Teacher or Community Member
- Principal's statement

The Scholarship is valued at \$5000 and is to be used to assist in the cost of full-time tertiary study. Up to five Scholarships will be awarded in 2023. Successful students will receive \$5000 in two payments of \$2500 each. Applications for 2023 Scholarships will close on Friday 22 September 2023. Late applications will not be accepted. Applications need to be to Leah by 3.20 pm on Monday 18 September – so we can add the Year 12 Semester 2 2023 Report, the Trial HSC results and the Principal's Recommendation Section.

Some background information on why the Scholarship exists:

Jim Anderson, the former Member for Londonderry in the NSW State Parliament and a former Mayor of Blacktown City Council, passed away suddenly on 22 March 2003. Mr Anderson worked tirelessly for public education and he was deeply committed to improving the future for young people in Western Sydney.

In April 2003 the former Premier of NSW, Mr Bob Carr MP announced the establishment of the *Jim Anderson Scholarships* to honour Mr Anderson's memory. The Scholarship provides financial support for up to five students each year who are currently enrolled in an eligible Western Sydney government high school.

To be eligible for the award of a Jim Anderson Scholarship in 2023 students must:

- Have completed their Higher School Certificate in 2023.
- Gained a position in a fulltime course for 2024 at a TAFE NSW college or campus OR at the Western Sydney University and provide proof of enrolment.
- In 2023 be enrolled at one of the eligible NSW government schools or campuses (which SMSHS is).

The application form for this scholarship has been emailed to all Year 12 students on 23 August 2023)
