#### **Principal's Report**

Many thanks to all of our staff, students and parents for helping us to get the new school year off to a positive start. We have had many comments from students and staff, as well as phone calls from community members regarding the smooth start to the year. I would particularly like to extend a warm welcome to the new members of our community, students, parents and staff. I hope your relationship with St Marys Senior High School is one which is positive and rewarding.

The Department of Education is transitioning from the current finance package used within schools and this will require work to be completed behind the scenes. For this to occur smoothly we will not be able to receive or transact any monies over the counter or online between 6 am Wednesday 15 February and 6 am Tuesday 21 February 2023. I apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Just a reminder about dropping students off in the morning and picking them up in the afternoon. We ask that parents drop students and pick students up from

locations on Creek Road or Kungala Street. These areas are much easier to access, are safer and provide an easier exit rather than trying to navigate the narrow streets around Kalang Avenue.

Parents and guardians will have received permission notes for students for the school swimming carnival which is taking place on Friday 10 February 2023. This is the first whole school event for the year and a great opportunity for our students to come together in an informal environment.

We will be celebrating our top Higher School Certificate Achievers on Tuesday 14 February at our Academic Excellence Assembly. All students will be attending this event with further details provided later in this newsletter. We look forward to sharing with our community the diverse pathways our students undertake and celebrating their achievements.

As a result of the Academic Excellence Assembly, the Valentine's Day celebration run by the Student Representative Council will take place on Wednesday 15 February. The SRC have provided some information about this event in this newsletter.

Year 12 will soon commence their first session with their Personal Mentors. This is an additional layer of support provided to support students in their final year of formal schooling. The connections made in Personal Mentor have been highly valued by past students, as highlighted in our exit survey data. This is just one layer of wellbeing support provided at St Marys. As a school we understand that wellbeing is essential. Feeling supported, caring for others and being physically and mentally healthy is essential. We ask that if any of our students find that they are struggling that they reach out as soon as possible to allow us to work together.

#### How do I get involved with the school?

St Marys Senior High School does not have a P&C group. A School Council made up of parents, students, community members and staff make up the Council and meet on the fourth Tuesday of every month. Each representative group has a specific number of voting rights and are elected at the annual general meeting, the first meeting of the year. The AGM will take place on Tuesday 28 February 2023 via Zoom. If parents want to be involved in decision making related to our school and develop a better understanding of the school's operations this may be the path you choose to take. The parent representative group requires three voting members at each meeting that can be rotated. I encourage you to consider attending the first meeting to gain an insight into the School Council.

I hope everyone has a great fortnight at St Marys Senior High School, and I look forward to a fantastic year ahead.

#### Code of conduct for school students on metro and train services, and at stations

Transport

All students are to behave in a manner that ensures both their comfort and safety and that of other passengers in order to retain their School travel pass.

#### Students will:

- Obey all signage instructions on metro and train services and at stations.
- Behave safely at all times (e.g. avoid running or riding bikes, scooters or skates on metro and train services and at stations, keep off metro and train lines, keep arms, legs and other body parts inside the metro or train, refrain from touching metro or train doors, safety equipment or any part of a moving metro or train).
- Use non-offensive language and behave appropriately at all times on rail property (e.g. avoid swearing, spitting, fighting, throwing items, keep feet off seats).
- Protect rail property and report graffiti and vandalism.
- Keep yourself and anything you are carrying clear of aisles, steps, thoroughfares and behind the yellow line on platforms.
- Take your rubbish with you and dispose of it thoughtfully.
- Follow the instructions of station staff, drivers, guards, transport officers and Police officers.
- Carry your School Pass during all school-related travel.
- Spread out along the platform so as not to overcrowd one carriage. Avoid boarding carriages that are already overcrowded.
- Allow other passengers to get off metro and train services before boarding and then board without delay.
- Move inside the carriage and stand away from the doors during travel.
- Comply with all laws relating to conduct and behaviour while travelling on public transport.
- Not possess any prohibited items, such as knives, spray cans or other implement intended for use in damaging property.
- Adhere to the law that bans smoking and drinking alcohol at stations, and on metro and train services.
- Use the School Travel Pass only for its intended purpose.
- Keep their School pass for their own use not lend their School pass to other students or borrow one from them



If issued with a School Opal card, students must always tap on at the beginning of their metro and train trips and tap off at the end, even at stations without ticket gates.

The School pass may be confiscated and a fine may also apply if these rules are not followed.

Vandalism is a serious criminal offence. Students caught tagging, etching or vandalising metro and train services and stations will be arrested and may face criminal charges.

Consequences of inappropriate behaviour

**Unacceptable behaviour** such as using offensive or racist language, disobeying reasonable directions from the driver, smoking, spitting, damaging property, eating on the bus, distracting the driver with persistent noise and failing to show the travel pass may lead to:

- Loss of subsidised school travel privileges for up to two school weeks for a second offence,
   and up to 10 school weeks for subsequent offences.
- Permanent suspension of school travel privileges or banning from travelling on buses may apply for repeated offences.

**Dangerous behaviour** such as seriously bullying or harassing other passengers, fighting, letting any part of your body protrude from the bus, throwing objects inside or outside the bus, using matches and lighters, carrying dangerous items and group misbehaviour may lead to:

- Loss of subsidised school travel privileges for up to four school weeks for a first offence and up to 10 school weeks for subsequent offences - or if group misbehaviour is involved, permanent loss of school travel privileges.
- Permanent suspension of school travel privileges or banning from travelling on buses may apply for repeated offences.

**Highly dangerous behaviour** such as interfering with safety equipment, pushing students out of the doors or windows, assaulting the driver or other passengers and destruction of bus property may lead to:

- Permanent loss of subsidised school travel privileges, and possible court action or police prosecution
- Banned from travelling on buses.

The police will be called to deal with highly dangerous behaviour.



These penalties reflect the seriousness of the misbehaviour. They ensure that all students who misbehave on buses are dealt with in a fair and consistent manner, no matter which bus operator or school is involved

If students are refused travel, parents/guardians/carers must make alternative travel arrangements and meet any costs of that transport. They will not be eligible for the Transport for NSW Private Vehicle Conveyance Scheme under these circumstances.

A group of school students behaving unacceptably may risk higher penalties if their conduct puts the safety of other passengers or the driver at risk.

The operator will inform Transport for NSW of its decision. Transport for NSW may inform an operator of a student's record of misbehaviour. Please refer to the Guidelines for Managing School Students' Behaviour on Buses for dealing with incidents of inappropriate behaviour.

If a student misbehaves on a bus, the bus operator concerned will contact the parents and the school.

- Depending on the gravity of the offence, students may be required to give up their school bus travel pass or may be refused travel on the bus for a period of time determined by the bus operator.
- Heavier penalties may apply to students involved in group misbehaviour.
- School principals have the right to take additional disciplinary action against a student under the school's discipline code or student welfare policy for any breach of the code of conduct.

The bus operator must provide written notification to the parents, guardians or carers before a student's school bus travel pass can be withdrawn.

What to do if you disagree

If parents, guardians or carers don't agree with a decision, they should contact the bus operator. If they are still not satisfied, they can contact the nearest Transport for NSW office.



#### **School Swimming Carnival**

We are so excited to be holding our whole school swimming carnival on Friday 10 February after three years of disruptions. The swimming carnival is a great opportunity for our athletes to showcase their talent and qualify for the Werrington Zone Championships.

Students will be required to be at Ripples Pool, St Marys for roll marking at 8.20 am. It is advised that, if driving, students park at school and walk across the road due to Council parking restrictions. It would be great to see students dressed up in their Cluster colours – Cluster 2 are the Tigers (orange), Cluster 3 are the Lions (yellow), Cluster 5 are the Panthers (pink), Cluster 6 are the Bulls (red), Cluster 7 are the Whales (blue) and Cluster 8 are the Serpents (green). Students have the opportunity to enter traditional swimming events as well as novelty events. All students entering events earn points for their Cluster. The carnival will conclude with a Year 11 v Year 12 Challenge.

Students are welcome to bring their own food and drink (no glass bottles) and will also be able to purchase food from the canteen facilities. Students will be dismissed from the pool at the conclusion of the carnival at 1 pm.

We are hopeful the weather will be on our side, and everyone is encouraged to remember sun protection – slip, slop, slap and wrap!





Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available









### cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope

#### STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

#### STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

#### STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned to your school 4-6 weeks after the day of photography

#### IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.
