This information has already been provided to students and families through email and our range of communication platforms. Principal's Report continued

The Phase One approach that we will move to this week was established by the NSW Government based on health advice. We are aware that some 7-12 schools are bringing Year 12 students back more than one day per week but the current guidelines prevent us from doing the same. The Director of Educational Leadership for our area and myself have been in regular contact regarding specific concerns related to Year 12 and the Higher School Certificate. The Premier has indicated that schools may jump from Phase One to Phase Three in a two week period which would then allow all students to return to their normal timetable on site.

In our Phase One approach outlined later in this newsletter, when students have a face to face lesson this will be with their normal class teacher provided the teacher is not on leave or required to work from home. Teachers working from home will still be preparing and delivering lessons through remote learning and supported by another staff member at our school.

We have enough supplies to ensure each classroom has disinfectant wipes and hand sanitiser. We will be asking students to wipe their desk down prior to each lesson commencing. We understand that parents might prefer that this be done at the conclusion of the previous lesson, but we felt that this process would help ensure the wiping down was done thoroughly rather than in a rush. The Department of Education has allocated one additional cleaner to work throughout the day to provide enhanced cleaning in high traffic areas.

I know I have reminded Year 12 of this previously but please ensure that you are following our Careers Facebook page, Opportunity Knocks and the associated Google Classroom to ensure you are kept up to date regarding any opportunities for early entry to universities or colleges. The information provided through these forums may assist students to prepare for transition from school to their chosen pathway.

Our school canteen (fondly known as 'The Caf') will be open for the phased return of students to school. This will allow students to remain on site during the recess break if they choose to rather than going across to The Village Shopping Centre. The Little House on Campus who run this facility values any feedback that students provide to them to ensure they are meeting the needs of our school.

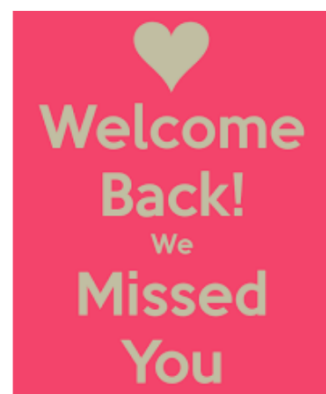

- Continued enhanced cleaning and hygiene supply arrangements.

Students at school five days per week, with social distancing measures.

- Students with increased health risks may continue to learn at home to suit their individual needs.
- Students remain in the same classroom for the day, break times can be staggered to reduce mixing between class groups.
- No excursions or inter-school activities.
- Continued enhanced cleaning and hygiene supply arrangements.

Students at school five days per week, with full school activities.

- Normal school breaks and entry/exit processes will resume.
- Infection control procedures will continue on a school by school basis.
- Communication to staff, students and families regarding NSW Health advice will continue.
- Continued communication to the Early Childhood Education sector regarding NSW Health Advice.

Phase 1 – Additional Measures

The following measures will be implemented in Phase 1 to support the safe return of our students and staff:

- Students will be expected to observe social distancing measures in classrooms and on the grounds of St Marys Senior High School to reduce the risk of COVID–19 spreading.
- Each classroom will have hand sanitiser available for students and staff.
- Additional hand sanitiser will be available in common areas.
- Common areas such as the Learning Centre, Library and Cafeteria will have reduced seating available to limit the number of students in one place.
- The Department of Education will be providing additional thermometers should a student or staff member present as unwell. Please note we will NOT be taking student temperatures daily. If a student presents as unwell, the student will be isolated and parents (or emergency contacts if parents are not available) will be contacted to collect the student from school. If staff present as unwell they will be sent home.
- The Department of Education has indicated that they will be providing additional cleaning throughout the day and hygiene products.
- Bubblers will not be available for use. Students will need to have a water bottle to access the water fountains on campus.
- Additional signage will be placed around the campus reminding students and staff of social distancing principles.

Online Peer Tutoring – FAQs

What is Online Peer Tutoring?

It's just like Peer Tutoring in the Learning Centre but it will now be conducted online to coincide with Remote Learning!

Who are the Peer Tutors?

Peer Tutors are Year 12 students who excelled in their Preliminary studies and have volunteered their time to help you. So they're super keen and committed to help!

What can a Peer Tutor help me with?

Peer Tutors are able to answer your questions about course content, provide explanations of course specific concepts and assist with study techniques. They are not able to proof-read, assist with or mark assessment tasks in line with All My Own Work. If you have any questions about assessments tasks, please contact your class teacher.

How do I know a Peer Tutor will answer my question on Discord?

Peer Tutors will be available on Discord during a self-nominated study period to answer your questions. Just remember to @Tutor in the relevant subject channel. A Peer Tutor roster will be pinned for you to see when they're available.

What if I want to ask a question before or after school?

Even though it is possible to ask questions before or after school, please be mindful and considerate about expecting responses to your questions outside of school hours. Peer Tutors have their own school work to complete and other commitments too

There isn't a Peer Tutor for the subject I need help with. Will there be new Peer Tutors?

Hopefully, yes! Applications are currently being circulated to keen Year 12 students who have provided the SRC with an expression of interest to be a new Peer Tutor. Keep an eye on the 'SMSHS Study Group' for the new Peer Tutors.

Will the Discord 'SMSHS Study Group' be monitored by teachers?

Yes! Teachers will monitor the Discord group.

What are the expectations of students while using Discord?

Students are expected to be polite and courteous in all their responses and have a username that reflects their real name.

I would like to contact a Peer Tutor but not in Discord. How can I do that?

Please email Nicole (nicole.leong2@det.nsw.edu.au) and she will pass on your question(s) to a Peer Tutor. Please make sure that you include the following information in your email:

1. The subject you need help with;
2. The question(s) you would like answered.

Do I need to do anything after receiving Online Peer Tutoring?
