

Principal's Report

Welcome back to the classroom Year 11 and 12. I am hoping as you are receiving your results from your examinations that you can find some time to reflect on your achievements and areas of improvement. Our goal is always to achieve our 'personal best'.

Year 11 students will be nominating for the positions of School Captain and Vice Captain, starting in Week 9. This process will occur a little later this year and will be slightly different, due to the restrictions in place in relation to school assemblies. Students will go through a rigorous process to demonstrate their ability to lead the student body. I wish all candidates the best and thank them for their leadership, courage and dedication to serve others.

Over Weeks 6 and 7 of this term, Year 11 is engaged in the process of transitioning to Year 12 with Liz Hemmings, our Head Teacher Secondary Studies providing a range of resources to Mentor Teachers to help guide students. A link to the presentation provided to students is included in this newsletter so that parents and caregivers can be informed of both the process and NESA requirements. I am so proud of every student for their effort and creativity. Unfortunately, our community showcases are unable to proceed this year but this should not distract us from the effort Year 12 students have dedicated to their projects and performances.

Every year St Marys Senior High School awards three school based scholarships to graduating Year 12 students. These scholarships are given in the memory of the founding Principals of St Marys High School and St Marys Senior High School, Mr Bill Eason and Mr Bernie Shepherd and a member of our Commercial Studies staff, Mr James Rowe. The scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated excellence in the humanities, sciences and technology or who are pursuing a career in education. Students are encouraged to apply for these scholarships, with further details contained later in this newsletter.

Earlier this year NESA announced that they would push the Higher School Certificate Examinations back by three school days to allow students more time to prepare. We will not be operating formal timetabled lessons in the period between the start of Term 4 and the first English examination as we are very conscious of the different examination timetables individual students have. Year 12 teachers will be available during this time in normal timetabled lessons to work with students in a variety of ways.

Finally a reminder about the updated Term 3 guidelines in relation to COVID-19. Staff and students who have a COVID-19 test are required to show evidence of a negative test result before returning to school. Staff and students are not to return (even after a negative test result) unless they have no cold or flu symptoms. NSW Health have indicated that Year 12 students will be treated as a priority (similar to essential workers) when they are tested. Please ensure if you are in Year 12 and are required to have a COVID-19 test due to ill health that you advise the heath workers carrying out the test that you are a HSC student.

The James Rowe Award

The James Rowe Award was instituted in 2012 and is presented annually to an HSC student who is pursuing a career as a teacher in education. The successful applicant needs to demonstrate a passion and commitment to teaching as well as being interested or involved in social change and have consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in a minimum of three subjects.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the pursuit of a career in teaching.

This is demonstrated by enrolment in a teaching degree at university. Areas to address in your application:

- a) Passion and commitment to teaching
- b) Interest and action in social change

The Bill Eason Award

The Bill Eason Award is presented annually to a HSC student who, in the opinion of the school community, has consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies in the humanities area while at the same time demonstrating a significant contribution to the development of the local community or the school community of St Marys Senior High School.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in a minimum of three subjects in the humanities field.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the school community of St Marys Senior High School or their local community. This may be derived from a variety of fields, including:
 - a) Student leadership
 - b) School service
 - c) Community Service

The Bernie Shepherd Award

The Bernie Shepherd Award is presented annually to a HSC student who, in the opinion of the school community, has consistently displayed an exemplary attitude towards their studies in the science and technology areas while at the same time demonstrating a significant contribution to the development of the local community or the school community of St Marys Senior High School.

Criteria - The successful applicant should address the following:

- 1. Outstanding performance in a minimum of three subjects in the science and technology fields.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to the school community of St Marys Senior High School or their local community. This may be derived from a variety of fields, including:
 - a) Student leadership
 - b) School service
 - c) Community Service

To apply for the Bernie Shepherd, Bill Eason or James Rowe Awards

Please submit a written application to Danielle Ervine by 3:20 pm on Friday 18 September 2020.

The application should be no more than FOUR A4 typed pages in length (12 point font size and 1.5 line spacing) and address ALL of the criteria listed for the relevant award.

In addition to your application, school records will be accessed by the School Council as part of the process to select the successful scholarship applicant.
