Congratulations to our Captains for 2021, Alice Chitos and Chloe Nolasco, and Vice Captains, Bree Fitzpatrick and Mohmd Alsomay. I am sure they will do an outstanding job and be well supported by the soon to be elected Student Representative Council.

In this newsletter you will find some information about the Sydney Metro which will connect St Marys Train Station to the new Aerotropolis Precinct. This will involve significant work to upgrade St Marys Station and tunnel excavation works. We will be working closely with the Department of Education as well as with the Western Sydney Metro Project team to mitigate impacts on the school. The Environmental Impact Statement for the Sydney Metro has been placed on public exhibition until 2 December 2020. We will be preparing a submission along with School Infrastructure NSW for the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment which will also involve an acoustic consultant reviewing the EIS to determine any particular impacts on our school.

As Australia moves into the warmer months and into the next fire season, which we all hope is not as destructive as the previous season, the Department of Education will work closely with the Rural Fire Service NSW to ensure that all staff and students are safe. Although St Marys Senior High School is not closed when the fire danger rating is classified as catastrophic, some students and staff live in areas where there is significant bushland which may come under threat. We try to keep families updated regarding school operations through a variety of platforms including SkoolBag, Instagram and Facebook. Families can also keep updated through the Department's website: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/school-safety#Non-operational.

Students need to ensure that if they suffer from asthma that they carry their puffers with them at all times, but this is especially important when the outside environment is uncomfortable due to smoke settling in the Sydney basin. It is recommended that students try to stay indoors during their breaks and make use of the library, Learning Centre and cafeteria on days where the air quality is classified as poor. If students experience symptoms such as itchy or burning eyes, running nose, throat irritation, shortness of breath, headaches or coughing they should seek assistance from their class teacher or the front office.

As Year 12 2021 are starting their Higher School Certificate programs of study, it is important that students confirm their HSC entries **on Friday 27 November** to ensure that all of the details held by NESA are correct. The organisation regarding this process is provided on page 4, and I thank Liz Hemmings, our Head Teacher Secondary Studies, and all the staff who are involved in facilitating this process for their hard work.

Over the next few weeks many students will be completing their first assessment task for their HSC. I wish each of you all the best as you embark on your final year of schooling. Most students work through their HSC

<u>Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport:</u> <u>Project Factsheet for St Marys Senior High School</u>

Western Sydney Airport Metro is a State Significant Infrastructure project that proposes the construction and operation of a 23-kilometre metro rail line between St Marys in the north and the Aerotropolis Core precinct in the south.

The overarching aim of the project is to provide a dedicated metro rail connection to the future Western Sydney Airport (currently under construction) and the surrounding Aerotropolis precinct.

A total of 6 metro stations are proposed, comprising:

- St Marys Station (includes an interchange with the existing St Marys Station).
- Orchard Hills Station.
- Luddenham Road Station.
- Airport Business Park Station.
- Airport Terminal Station.
- Aerotropolis Core Station.

The proposed stations and route alignment of Western Sydney Airport Metro are shown in the image.

The indicative timeframe for the Western Sydney Airport Metro project is approximately five years, with main construction to commence in 2021 (subject to planning approval).




Impacts on St Marys Senior High School:

St Marys Senior High School is located:

- Approximately 320m from the proposed St Marys Metro Station;
- Approximately 150m from part of the proposed St Marys Metro Station construction site (and associated haulage routes); and
- Directly above part of the proposed underground metro tunnel (at the northern edge of the site).

This is shown in the image below.



The works proposed within the subject EIS may impact the ongoing operation of St Marys Senior High School during construction and operation. Notwithstanding this, the project will provide a range of on-going long-term benefits for the school, including taking cars off surrounding roads and promoting in the generation of sustainable outcomes.

The table on the following pages provides answers to a range of questions relating to the construction and operation of Western Sydney Airport Metro on St Marys Senior High School.



Question	Answer
What is the anticipated construction timeframe for the works closest to my school?	The indicative construction program indicates that construction works will be undertaken at the St Marys Metro Station construction site between Q3 2021 to Q4 2026. The indicative timeframe for metro tunnelling works between St Marys Metro Station to Orchard Hills Metro Station is between Q1 2022 to Q2 2023. Sometime during this period (currently unknown), tunnel boring will occur under the northern edge of the school site at an appropriate depth to minimise temporary construction and ongoing vibration impacts. It is anticipated that these specific tunnelling works under the school site will last a few days.
Will there be any impacts on school access during the construction period?	Access to St Marys Senior High School will not generally be impacted during construction, as roads surrounding the school are not proposed to be closed. However, it is likely that there may be slight delays to performance times on roads surrounding the school, because: There will be workers commuting to and from the St Marys Metro Station construction site; There will be a range of construction vehicles entering/exiting the St Marys Metro Station construction site; and Phillip Street and Glossop Street are marked as haulage routes for construction vehicles, which may slow vehicles trying to enter/exit these roads.
Will construction impact on school drop off and pick-up arrangements?	St Marys Senior High School drop off and pick up arrangements off Kalang Avenue should not generally be impacted during construction. This is because dedicated construction vehicles will be required to use Phillip Street and Glossop Street, as these streets have been nominated as dedicated haulage routes for the project. Kalang Avenue and adjoining roads are not proposed haulage routes. Notwithstanding this, as identified above, there may be slight delays in accessing the school and associated drop off and pick up spaces compared to current times, due to likely increases in traffic on surrounding roads near the St Marys Metro Station construction site.

What are the proposed truck movements during the construction period?	During the construction period, the majority of the construction staff are expected to arrive before 7:00 am and the haulage trucks are expected to start arriving around 7:30 am. Based on the above, the peak hours for the construction scenarios are 7:30 am to 8:30 am for the morning peak hour and 4:30 pm to 5:30 pm for the evening peak hour. Light deliveries and heavy vehicles will enter and exit throughout each site's respective shift hours. Indicative peak construction vehicle movements for light deliveries (LV) and heavy vehicle (HV) movements for the St Marys Metro Station are summarised below:

Where necessary, mitigation measures are proposed to manage pedestrian, cyclist and motorist safety during the construction phase. This includes consideration of on-going haulage routes, deployment of speed awareness signs and community education.

institutions, it is highly likely that there will be temporary on-going noise impacts resulting from construction.

Noise impacts resulting from construction will be managed by Sydney Metro through the implementation of standard and additional mitigation measures in accordance with the Sydney Metro Construction Noise and Vibration Standard. These include the following measures:

- Works Scheduling When working adjacent to schools, medical facilities and childcare centres, particularly noisy activities would be scheduled outside normal working hours, where feasible and reasonable.
- Avoid the coincidence of noisy plant working simultaneously close together and adjacent to sensitive receivers.
- Where feasible and reasonable heavy vehicle movements would be limited to daytime hours.
- Use structures to shield residential receivers from noise, such as noise barriers (where practicable).
- A noise monitoring program is to be carried out for the duration of critical works in accordance with the Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan.

Acoustic sheds around the St Marys Station construction site may also be implemented, depending on the noise levels experienced during construction.

* standard construction hours include Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8 am to 1pm.

Will there be any impacts on air quality during construction?

Given the large scale of development activities to be undertaken, there is potential for dust related impacts at St Marys Senior High School. These impacts are likely to be temporary and nature and will be reduced given the distance of the school from the construction site.

Dust impacts will be mitigated through the implementation of management measures. These measures include:

- Appropriate vehicle speeds on sealed and unsealed roads.
- Water suppression will be used for active earthwork areas, stockpiles, unsurfaced haul roads and loads of soil being transported to reduce wind-blown dust emissions.



	 Dust extraction and filtration systems will be installed for tunnel excavation works and deep excavation with limited surface exposure. Regularly inspect dust emissions and apply additional controls as required. Best-practice odour management measures will also be implemented during relevant construction works by the project team.
Will there be any vibration impacts during construction and operation?	 St Marys Senior High School should not generally experience vibration impacts during construction and operation. This is because: The school is located a considerable distance away from proposed haulage routes; Vibration will be managed through the implementation of standard and additional mitigation measures contained to the Sydney Metro Construction Noise and Vibration Standard; and The proposed metro tunnel under the northern edge of the St Marys Senior High School site is to be located at an appropriate depth and sealed.
Are there any visual changes that will impact the school?	No adverse visual changes will impact St Marys Senior High School as a result of the development. The construction site is located approximately 150m away from the school site between a range of streets and dwelling houses, which will block the construction site from view.
Will there be any overshadowing impacts from the works on the school?	No.
