### **Year 11 2021 – Looking at our school assessment policy and procedures**

We have created some materials for our Year 11 students to help explore some of the key elements of our school’s assessment policy and procedures. This will help to ensure that students can make the best possible attempt at each of their tasks, starting in Week 6 of this term.

A Google Classroom has been set up for Year 12 2022 (code: u3c7yea), and students have received an invitation in their school email account to join this online forum. *We already have over 400 students who have joined!*

We ask that each Year 11 student join the Classroom, and take some time in Week 5 to watch the presentation and read through the materials provided. After this, each student is asked to complete a simple online quiz, to help us to identify areas where further explanations may be needed. A great time for students to do this is during the **Period 0 lesson on Thursday 25 February**, when Year 12 have a Biology HSC assessment task. However, students can complete these activities during their own time at any point in Week 5, either at home or in the spaces provided for students at our school.

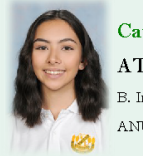

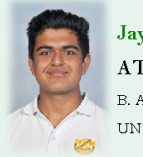

## Student Concession Entitlement Cards

These cards can be picked up by students at our school's front office. They are valid until the expiry date printed on the card, provided the student continues to be enrolled at St Marys Senior High School.

*Should your Student Concession Entitlement card be expiring **BEFORE** you complete your schooling at St Marys Senior High School, please advise the Front Office at school **at least 4 weeks** before expiry so that a new card can be ordered.*



## Concession Entitlement

- Concession fares on train, bus, light rail, metro, Sydney Ferries and NSW TrainLink services
- Concession fares on rural and regional bus services
- Concession Airport station access fee
- Child / Youth Opal card fares
- Not available on Manly Fast Ferry services, Special Event services or charter buses
- Privately owned and operated services may offer concessions at their own discretion, check with the operator before travelling

## Card types issued are as follows:-

### Senior Secondary Students (SSS)

- Senior Secondary Student Concession is applicable only for students 16 years or older
- Cards display product code (SSS)

### Mature Secondary Students (MSS)

- Senior Secondary Student Concession is applicable only for students 18 years or older
- Cards display product code (MSS)

### Proof Of Age (POA)

- Enables students to verify to transport staff that they are under 16 years of age
- Cards display product code (POA)



## Conditions of Use

Applicable for Senior Secondary Student, Mature Senior Secondary, and Proof Of Age Concession cards:

- The Concession Entitlement is not transferrable and may only be used by the pass holder named on the card
- Valid only when showing all holder details, school information and expiry date
- A pass is rendered invalid by alteration, erasure or damage
- The card must be carried at all times when travelling, and be produced when purchasing tickets or as requested by Transport Officers or Transport Police
- Improper use of the card may result in forfeiture of future NSW travel entitlements

## Lost, stolen or damaged cards

When a student's concession entitlement card has been lost, stolen or damaged, please apply for a replacement card at the Front Office of St Marys Senior High School. While waiting for a replacement card, students should travel with a valid ticket.

## Change of Circumstances

When a student leaves the school, the Concession Entitlement card must be forfeited to the school before signing out.

## School photos for 2021

1. Our school photos will be taken on **Tuesday 2 March 2021** (Week 6B of this term).
2. Each student will sit for an individual portrait picture – with students in:
  - **Year 12** meeting in front of the MPC at the **start of Period 1** (8:20 am).
  - **Year 11** meeting in front of the MPC at the **start of Period 3** (11:14 am).



3. On arriving in front of the MPC:
  - Students have their belongings with them throughout the photo process.
  - Students line up in alphabetical order according to their surnames. Initially, they will assemble in letter groups – then we will work to ensure they are in alphabetical order in these groups.
  
4. Classes on the day:
  - All **Year 12 students** will remain out of class all of Period 1 to have their photos taken, with teaching staff on supervision. Any students still needing to have their photo taken during Period 2 will be sent back to class as quickly as possible. The other lessons on the day will operate as usual.
  - All **Year 11 students** will remain out of class all of Period 3 to have their photos taken, with teaching staff on supervision. Any students still needing to have their photo taken during Period 4 will be sent back to class as quickly as possible. The other lessons on the day will operate as usual.
  
5. Every student will pose for a picture which will then be compiled into a year group picture. *Even if a student chooses not to buy a picture, it is important that every student has a picture taken for our school and NESAs records.*
  
6. On the day, the photo dress code involves each student wearing **a white school shirt with the school crest.**
  
7. Order forms have been handed out to Year 11 students in Mentor, and to Year 12 students in Personal Mentor.
  - Students will need to write their class code on their envelope (these are also included over the page).
  - Those students who have prepaid online do not need to bring their envelopes with them on the day.
  
8. Photos can be prepaid online via [www.advancedlife.com.au](http://www.advancedlife.com.au) or can be paid for on the day with **correct cash** or cheques (made out to *Advanced Photographers Pty Ltd*).



9. The name written on the order form should be **the student's legal/official name** – this name is used for a number of documents in the school and for the HSC, and it should be spelt correctly and written clearly.
10. In case of wet weather, the photos will still be taken as outlined above.
11. A number of COVID-safe arrangements have been put in place for the day as required by the photographer's COVID-Safe Plan. This includes:
- No facility to provide change for cash payments,
  - Limiting student numbers in the MPC,
  - Limiting student time in the MPC.
